Dear Shareholder

This letter accompanies the 2013 Annual Report and gives details of the business to be transacted at the 2014 Annual General Meeting of the Company.

Annual General Meeting

Notice of the Annual General Meeting is given on page 5.

Resolutions 1 to 10 and 13 will be proposed as ordinary resolutions and resolutions 11 and 12 will be proposed as special resolutions.

Resolution 1 – Company’s Annual Report and Accounts 2013 (ordinary resolution)

Company law requires the Directors to present to the Annual General Meeting the Annual Accounts, the Directors’ Report and the Auditors’ Report on these accounts.

Resolutions 2 to 7 – Election of Directors (ordinary resolutions)

The articles of association of the Company require that the Directors not already elected by the Company in general meeting be put up for election at the next Annual General Meeting. As this will be the first Annual General Meeting of the Company, each of the Directors (being Stuart Rogers, Wayne Thornhill, Sharon Daniels, Simon Small, Paul Kidney and Michael Higgins) are offering themselves for election and resolutions 2 to 7 (inclusive) propose the election of such Directors. Stuart Rogers, Paul Kidney and Michael Higgins are each members of both the audit and remuneration committees.

Resolutions 8 and 9 – Re-appointment of auditors and determination of their remuneration (ordinary resolutions)

Company law requires the Company to appoint auditors at each Annual General Meeting at which accounts are presented, to hold office until the conclusion of the next such meeting. The audit committee has reviewed the effectiveness, independence and objectivity of the external auditors, PricewaterhouseCoopers LLP, on behalf of the Board, who now propose their re-appointment as the auditors of the Company. Resolution 9 authorises the Directors, in accordance with standard practice, to negotiate and agree the remuneration of the auditors. In practice, the audit committee will consider the audit fees for recommendation to the Board.

Resolution 10 – Authority to allot shares or grant subscription or conversion rights (ordinary resolution)

The resolution asks shareholders to grant the Directors authority under section 551 Companies Act 2006 to allot shares or grant such subscription or conversion rights as are contemplated by sections 551(1)(a)

and (b) respectively of the Companies Act 2006 up to a maximum aggregate nominal value of £68,375.14, being approximately two thirds of the nominal value of the issued ordinary share capital of the Company as at 30 January 2014. Of this authority, £34,187.57 is reserved for a fully pre-emptive rights issue.

This is the maximum permitted amount under best practice corporate governance guidelines. The authority will expire at the next Annual General Meeting. However, the Directors consider it important to have the maximum ability and flexibility commensurate with good corporate governance guidelines to raise finance to enable the company to respond to market development and conditions.

Resolution 11 – Disapplication of pre-emption rights (special resolution)

If the Directors wish to allot new shares or other equity securities for cash, the Companies Act 2006 requires that such shares or other equity securities are offered first to existing shareholders in proportion to their existing holding. The allotment of equity securities as referred to in this resolution includes the sale of any shares which the Company holds in treasury following a purchase of its own shares. Resolution 11 asks shareholders to grant the Directors authority to allot equity securities for cash up to an aggregate nominal value of £15,384.41 (being approximately 15 per cent. of the Company's issued ordinary share capital as at 30 January 2014) without first offering the securities to existing shareholders.

The resolution also disapplies the statutory pre-emption provisions in connection with a rights issue only in relation to the amount permitted under Resolution 11 allowing the Directors to make appropriate arrangements in relation to fractional entitlements or other legal or practical problems which might arise. The authority will expire at the next Annual General Meeting.

Resolution 12 – Purchases of own shares by the Company (special resolution)

Resolution 12 seeks authority from shareholders for the Company to make market purchases of its own ordinary shares, such authority being limited to the purchase of up to 15,384,408 ordinary shares (being approximately 15 per cent. of the Company's issued ordinary share capital as at 30 January 2014). The maximum and minimum prices payable are also limited in the resolution. The authority will only be exercised if the Directors consider that there is likely to be a beneficial impact on earnings per ordinary share and that it is in the best interests of the Company at the time. The Company will be able to hold the ordinary shares which have been repurchased as treasury shares and re-sell them for cash, cancel them or use them for the purposes of its employee share schemes.

Warrants and options to subscribe for up to 11,342,237 ordinary shares have been granted and are outstanding as at 30 January 2014 (being the latest practicable date prior to publication of this document) representing 11.04 per cent. of the issued ordinary share capital at that date. If the Directors were to exercise in full the power for which they are seeking authority under resolution 12, the warrants and options outstanding as at 22 January 2014 would represent 9.94 per cent. of the ordinary share capital (excluding shares held in treasury) in issue following such exercise.

Resolution 13 – Political donations and political expenditure (ordinary resolution)

Part 14 of the Companies Act 2006 requires companies to seek shareholder approval for donations to or expenditure incurred in connection with any political party, political organisation or independent election candidate.

Although the Company does not intend (and none of its subsidiaries intend) to make donations to political parties or to independent election candidates, within the normal meaning of that expression, the definition in the legislation of “**political donations**” and “**political expenditure**” can extend to bodies such as those concerned with policy review, law reform, the representation of the business community and special interest groups, which the Company might wish to support. Accordingly, the Company is seeking authority to make donations up to an aggregate amount of £100,000.

Action to be taken

You are asked to either:

1. complete the attached Form of Proxy and return it, together with any power of attorney or other authority under which it is signed or a notarially certified or office copy thereof, to ***Equiniti Limited***,

Aspect House, Spencer Road, Lancing, West Sussex BN99 6DA, so as to arrive no later than 2 p.m. on 27 March 2014; or

2. if you hold your shares in uncertificated form, use the CREST electronic proxy appointment service as described below.

Completion of the Form of Proxy or appointment of a proxy through CREST does not prevent a member from attending and voting in person.

Shares held in uncertificated form – electronic proxy appointment through CREST

CREST members who wish to appoint a proxy or proxies by utilising the CREST electronic proxy appointment service may do so for the Annual General Meeting and any adjournment(s) thereof by utilising the procedures described in the CREST Manual. CREST personal members or other CREST sponsored members, and those CREST members who have appointed (a) voting service provider(s), should refer to their CREST sponsor or voting service provider(s), who will be able to take the appropriate action on their behalf.

In order for a proxy appointment made by means of CREST to be valid, the appropriate CREST message (a “**CREST Proxy Instruction**”) must be properly authenticated in accordance with Euroclear UK & Ireland’s specifications and must contain the information required for such instructions, as described in the CREST Manual. The message must be transmitted so as to be received by the issuer’s agent, IDA19, by 2 p.m. on 27 March 2014. For this purpose, the time of receipt will be taken to be the time (as determined by the timestamp applied to the message by the CREST Applications Host) from which the issuer’s agent is able to retrieve the message by enquiry to CREST in the manner prescribed by CREST.

CREST members and, where applicable, their CREST sponsors or voting service providers should note that Euroclear UK & Ireland does not make available special procedures in CREST for any particular messages. Normal system timings and limitations will therefore apply in relation to the input of CREST Proxy Instructions. It is the responsibility of the CREST member concerned to take (or, if the CREST member is a CREST personal member or sponsored member or has appointed (a) voting service provider(s), to procure that his CREST sponsor or voting service provider(s) take(s)) such action as shall be necessary to ensure that a message is transmitted by means of the CREST system by any particular time. In this connection, CREST members and, where applicable, their CREST sponsors or voting service providers are referred, in particular, to those sections of the CREST Manual concerning practical limitations of the CREST system and timings.

The Company may treat as invalid a CREST Proxy Instruction in the circumstances set out in Regulation 35(5)(a) of the Uncertificated Securities Regulations 2001 (as amended).

Location of meeting

The Annual General Meeting will be held at the offices of Travers Smith LLP, 10 Snow Hill, London EC1A 2AL.

Small Quoted Companies

The Company intends to comply with the Corporate Governance Guidelines for Smaller Quoted Companies, as published by the Quoted Companies Alliance insofar as is practicable for a public company of its size and stage of development.

Recommendation

The Board believes that the resolutions to be put to the Annual General Meeting are in the best interests of the shareholders as a whole and, accordingly, recommends that the shareholders vote in favour of the resolutions, as the Directors intend to do in respect of their beneficial shareholdings in the Company.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Annual General Meeting of Arria NLG plc (the “**Company**”) will be held at the offices of Travers Smith LLP, 10 Snow Hill, London EC1A 2AL on 31 March 2014 at 2 p.m. for the transaction of the following business:

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass the following resolutions, numbers 1 to 10 and 13 of which will be proposed as ordinary resolutions and numbers 11 and 12 of which will be proposed as special resolutions:

1. **THAT** the Company’s annual accounts for the year ended 30 September 2013, together with the Directors’ report and the auditors’ report on those, be received.
2. **THAT** Stuart Rogers be elected as a Director.
3. **THAT** Wayne Thornhill be elected as a Director.
4. **THAT** Sharon Daniels be elected as a Director.
5. **THAT** Simon Small be elected as a Director.
6. **THAT** Paul Kidney be elected as a Director.
7. **THAT** Michael Higgins be elected as a Director.
8. **THAT** PricewaterhouseCoopers LLP be re-appointed as auditors to the Company until the conclusion of the next Annual General Meeting of the Company.
9. **THAT** the Directors be authorised to fix the auditors’ remuneration.
10. **THAT** for the purposes of section 551 Companies Act 2006 (and so that expressions used in this resolution shall have the same meanings as in that section 551):
 - 10.1 the Directors be and are generally and unconditionally authorised to exercise all powers of the Company to allot shares and to grant such subscription and conversion rights as are contemplated by sections 551(1)(a) and (b) of the Companies Act 2006 respectively up to a maximum nominal amount of £34,187.57 to such persons and at such times and on such terms as they think proper during the period expiring at the end of the next Annual General Meeting of the Company (unless previously revoked or varied by the Company in general meeting); and further
 - 10.2 the Directors be and are generally and unconditionally authorised to exercise all powers of the Company to allot equity securities (as defined in section 560 of the Companies Act 2006) in connection with a rights issue in favour of the holders of equity securities and any other persons entitled to participate in such issue where the equity securities respectively attributable to the interests of such holders and persons are proportionate (as nearly as maybe) to the respective number of equity securities held by them up to an aggregate nominal amount of £34,187.57 during the period expiring at the end of the next Annual General Meeting of the Company subject only to such exclusions or other arrangements as the Directors may consider necessary or expedient to deal with fractional entitlements or legal or practical problems under the laws or requirements of any recognised regulatory body or stock exchange in any territory;
 - 10.3 the Company be and is hereby authorised to make prior to the expiry of such period any offer or agreement which would or might require such shares or rights to be allotted or granted after the expiry of the said period and the Directors may allot such shares or grant such rights in pursuance of any such offer or agreement notwithstanding the expiry of the authority given by this resolution;

so that all previous authorities of the Directors pursuant to the said section 551 be and are hereby revoked.

11. **THAT**, subject to the passing of resolution 10 set out in the Notice convening this Meeting, the Directors be and are empowered in accordance with section 570 Companies Act 2006 to allot equity securities (as defined in section 560 of the Companies Act 2006) for cash, pursuant to the authority conferred on them to allot such shares or grant such rights by that resolution, as if section 561(1) and sub-sections (1) – (6) of section 562 of the Companies Act 2006 did not apply to any such allotment, provided that the power conferred by this resolution shall be limited to:

11.1 the allotment of equity securities in connection with an issue or offering in favour of holders of equity securities (but in the case of the authority granted under resolution 10.2 by way of a rights issue only) and any other persons entitled to participate in such issue or offering where the equity securities respectively attributable to the interests of such holders and persons are proportionate (as nearly as may be) to the respective number of equity securities held by or deemed to be held by them on the record date of such allotment, subject only to such exclusions or other arrangements as the Directors may consider necessary or expedient to deal with fractional entitlements or legal or practical problems under the laws or requirements of any recognised regulatory body or stock exchange in any territory; and

11.2 the allotment (otherwise than pursuant to paragraph 11.1 above) of equity securities up to an aggregate nominal value not exceeding £15,384.41;

and this power, unless renewed, shall expire at the end of the next Annual General Meeting of the Company but shall extend to the making, before such expiry, of an offer or agreement which would or might require equity securities to be allotted after such expiry and the Directors may allot equity securities in pursuance of such offer or agreement as if the authority conferred hereby had not expired.

12. **THAT** the Company be and is hereby generally and unconditionally authorised for the purpose of section 701 Companies Act 2006 to make market purchases (as defined in section 693 of the said Companies Act 2006) of ordinary shares of £0.001 each in the capital of the Company (“**ordinary shares**”) provided that:

12.1 the maximum number of ordinary shares hereby authorised to be purchased is 15,384,408;

12.2 the minimum price (exclusive of expenses) which may be paid for such ordinary shares is £0.001 per share, being the nominal amount thereof;

12.3 the maximum price (exclusive of expenses) which may be paid for such ordinary shares shall be an amount equal to the higher of (i) 5 per cent. above the average of the middle market quotations for such shares taken from the AIM Appendix to The London Stock Exchange Daily Official List for the five business days immediately preceding the day on which the purchase is made and (ii) the higher of the price of the last independent trade of an ordinary share and the highest current independent bid for an ordinary share as derived from the trading venue where the purchase is carried out;

12.4 the authority hereby conferred shall (unless previously renewed or revoked) expire on the earlier of the end of the next Annual General Meeting of the Company and the date which is 18 months after the date on which this resolution is passed; and

12.5 the Company may make a contract to purchase its own ordinary shares under the authority conferred by this resolution prior to the expiry of such authority, and such contract will or may be executed wholly or partly after the expiry of such authority, and the Company may make a purchase of its own ordinary shares in pursuance of any such contract.


13. **THAT** the Company (and any of its subsidiaries) be and are hereby authorised to, for the purposes of Part 14 of the Companies Act 2006:

13.1 make political donations to any political party, political organisation or independent election candidate not exceeding £100,000 in total; and

13.2 incur political expenditure not exceeding £100,000 in total;

during the period beginning with the date of the passing of this resolution and ending at the conclusion of the Company's next following Annual General Meeting. For the purposes of this resolution, the expressions "**political donations**", "**political party**", "**political organisation**", "**independent election candidate**" and "**political expenditure**" have the meanings set out in Part 14 of the Companies Act 2006.

- Completion of the Form of Proxy or appointment of a proxy through CREST will not prevent a member from attending and voting in person.
- (iii) Pursuant to Regulation 41 of the Uncertificated Securities Regulations 2001 (as amended), only shareholders registered in the register of members of the Company as at 6 p.m. on 27 March 2014 shall be entitled to attend and vote at the Annual General Meeting in respect of the number of shares registered in their name at such time. If the Meeting is adjourned, the time by which a person must be entered on the register of members of the Company in order to have the right to attend and vote at the adjourned Meeting is 6 p.m. on the day prior to the day immediately before the date fixed for the adjourned Meeting (excluding any part of a day that is not a business day). Changes to the register of members after the relevant times shall be disregarded in determining the rights of any person to attend and vote at the Meeting.
 - (iv) In the case of joint holders, the vote of the senior holder who tenders a vote whether in person or by proxy shall be accepted to the exclusion of the votes of the other joint holders and, for this purpose, seniority shall be determined by the order in which the names stand in the register of members of the Company in respect of the relevant joint holding.
